within the framework of the co-operation between the Swiss Federal Department of Foreign Affairs and the Kosovo Specialist Chambers and Specialist Prosecutor's Office.

The Kosovo Specialist Chambers and Specialist Prosecutor's Office were established pursuant to an international agreement ratified by the Kosovo Assembly, a Constitutional Amendment and the Law on Kosovo Specialist Chambers and Specialist Prosecutor's Office. They are of temporary nature with a specific mandate and jurisdiction over crimes against humanity, war crimes and other crimes under Kosovo law, which were commenced or committed in Kosovo between 1 January 1998 and 31 December 2000 by or against citizens of Kosovo or the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia. The Kosovo Specialist Chambers and the Specialist Prosecutor's Office have a seat in The Hague, the Netherlands. Their staff is international, as are the Judges, the Specialist Prosecutor and the Registrar.

Requirements for Swiss candidates include:

- Physical and mental fitness to work also in an environment with limited infrastructure (Assignments are subject to successfully meeting the medical standards);
- Passive fluency in two Swiss national languages;
- CH-citizenship (Applications from persons with dual citizenship with country of assignment cannot be considered).

Assignment:

The assignments take place within the framework of the Swiss Expert Pool for Civilian Peacebuilding Section. Seconded experts to the KSC receive a contract from the Federal Department of Foreign Affairs for the duration of their deployment (<https://www.admin.ch/opc/de/classified-compilation/20042290/index.html>).
